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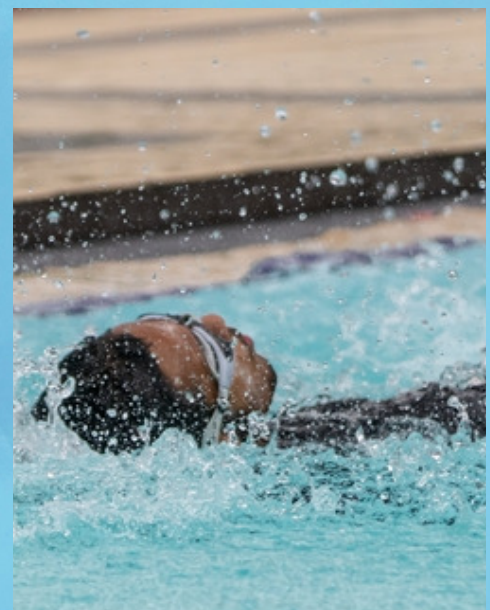

World Robot Olympiad 2025 National Selections - Sri Lanka

The World Robot Olympiad (WRO) Sri Lanka 2025 National Selections concluded at Burhani Serendib School Hall, Colombo 04, bringing together 28 student teams from across the country and nearly 250 spectators for a showcase of youth innovation in robotics and STEM. Graced by Hon. Hanif Yusuf, Governor of the Western Province, and Mr. Waruna Dhanapala, Secretary to the Ministry of Digital Economy, the event highlighted creative, socially impactful projects such as RoboMind's app-controlled automated dustbin and Smart Steps' smart walking stick for the visually impaired. Teams competed across Elementary, Junior, and Senior categories, with students from leading schools and institutions demonstrating strong technical skills, teamwork, and problem-solving. Supported by Meu Labs Pvt Ltd as Technical Partner and leading sponsors including Haycarb Pvt Ltd and Adamjee Lukmanjee and Sons Pvt Ltd, the competition was widely praised by judges for its high standard and real-world relevance. The event concluded with Burhani Serendib School teams advancing to represent Sri Lanka at the WRO International Finals in Singapore 2025, reinforcing the country's growing presence in global robotics and innovation.

P1- FOLDING UNIFORMS INDEPENDENTLY

Our Primary 1 students had a wonderful time learning how to fold their school uniforms neatly and independently. They practised folding trousers, tops, scarves and kurtas, discovering that keeping their uniforms tidy is not only helpful but also an important life skill. Through this hands-on activity, the children developed independence, built confidence and took pride in caring for their belongings—skills they will use every day both at school and at home.



Primary 1 pupils took part in an engaging activity that helped them learn how to look after their school clothing. They were shown how to neatly fold items such as trousers, tops, scarves and kurtas, helping them to understand the importance of being organised. This practical experience encouraged independence, responsibility and a sense of pride in caring for their own belongings—skills that will support them both in school and at home.

ORGANISING SCHOOL BAGS

Primary 1 students took part in a practical activity that focused on keeping their school bags neat and organised. They explored the best ways to arrange books, stationery, lunchboxes, and daily essentials so items could be accessed easily when needed. As they sorted and organised their bags, students learned how simple organisation can make their school day more comfortable and efficient. This activity also encouraged responsibility, self-reliance, and care for personal belongings—important habits for everyday learning.



P2 - FRACTIONS ACTIVITY

Primary 2 students explored the concept of fractions through an exciting hands-on activity. By identifying halves and quarters in a practical way, children found learning both enjoyable and meaningful. This interactive approach helped strengthen their understanding while encouraging active participation and curiosity in mathematics.



FIRST AID ACTIVITY

Our Primary 2 students were introduced to the basics of First Aid through an interactive learning session. They became familiar with common First Aid tools such as bandages, plasters, and cotton, and learned when and how to use them safely during minor emergencies. Through guided practice, children handled the materials gently and responsibly, building confidence and learning how to care for themselves and others.

CLEANING LUNCH BOXES

Our Primary 2 students enjoyed a hands-on Life Skills lesson on washing and caring for their lunch boxes. Clean lunch boxes, happy hearts! Through this simple yet meaningful activity, they practiced good hygiene, built responsibility, and developed independence. Learning to take care of their own belongings gave them a sense of pride and accomplishment, nurturing mindful and self-reliant habits that extend beyond the classroom.



P3- SHOE POLISHING & LACING



Primary 3 students stepped into a practical Life Skills session focused on shoe polishing and proper lacing. The activity encouraged patience and perseverance as students worked through the steps, turning initial challenges into moments of achievement. With growing confidence and enthusiasm, they completed their tasks successfully while learning the importance of personal care, responsibility, and everyday independence.

P4 - ENVELOPE MAKING

Primary 4 students engaged in a hands-on activity making envelopes, carefully measuring, folding and pasting with focus and precision. The task strengthened fine motor skills, encouraged organisation, and highlighted the importance of patience and neat work, making the session both productive and rewarding.



P5- HISTORY PROJECT



The Primary Five students actively participated in a creative activity in which they designed ornamental jewellery representing the cultural and historical significance of the era. Through planning and artistic expression, pupils explored traditions and craftsmanship, making learning meaningful and engaging. The hands-on task deepened their understanding while promoting unity, teamwork and collaboration.

The activity also helped develop creativity, problem-solving skills and confidence in presenting their work. Overall, the lesson offered both academic enrichment and meaningful character development, reinforcing historical understanding while aligning with our broader goal of value-based education. It also encouraged collaboration and reflection, allowing pupils to take ownership of their learning and appreciate different perspectives.

Through this experience, the learning objectives were achieved as pupils internalised values related to leadership, organisation and administration, reflecting the exemplary qualities of King Pandukabhaya.

3D SHAPES

INTERHOUSE BASKETBALL & NETBALL TOURNAMENT

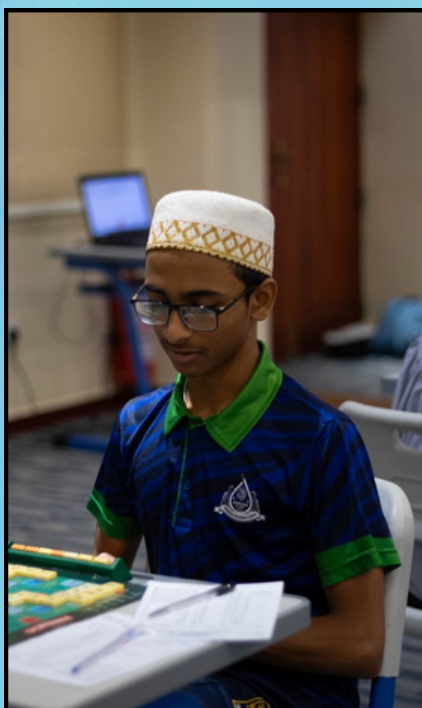

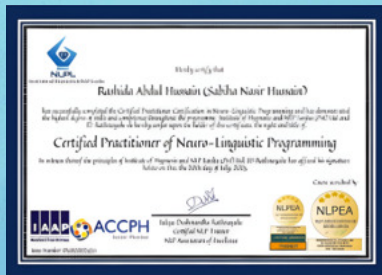

Ms. Safana Farook completed the **Certificate Course in Office Communication in English with Distinction**.

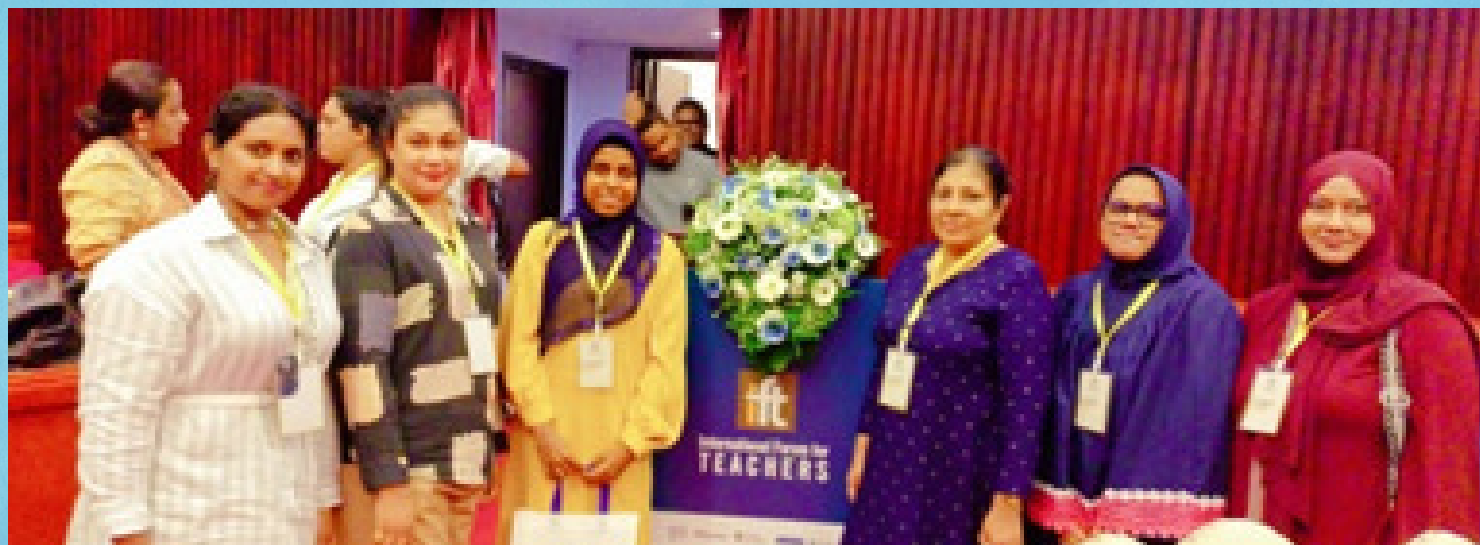
Mrs. Farida Huzefa Moosajee successfully completed the **Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT)** course and secured a position among the top five participants.

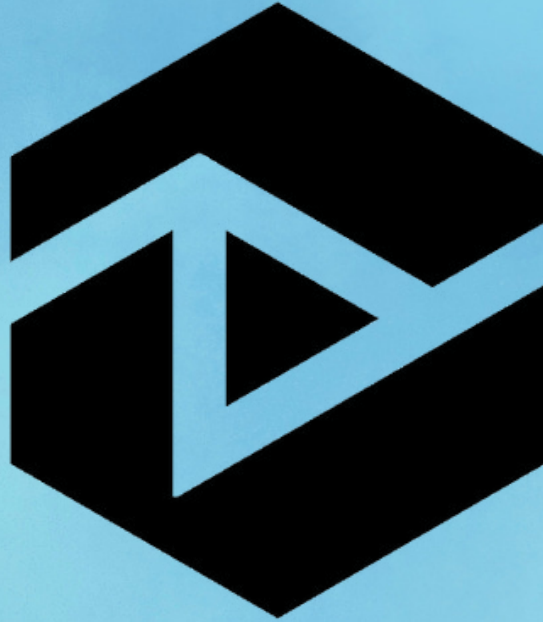
